At the heart of the festival is Liverpool Biennial's *International* exhibition, **Touched.** Selected international artists are invited to showcase their work, which are principally new commissions or key works previously unseen in the UK.

Touched is about art that moves you, that's close enough to be under your skin and stirs you in mind, body and soul. The exhibition is created by a spirited team of international curators, based in Liverpool, who draw on the unique qualities of the city to inspire artists to realise their ambitions.

In 2010 the International exhibition, Touched will present more artists than ever before, at some of the UK's foremost venues - Tate Liverpool, the Bluecoat, A Foundation Liverpool, FACT and Open Eye Gallery. With over half the commissions situated in public spaces and disused shops and warehouses – a feature of Liverpool Biennial since its inception in 1999 – the viewer will be touched by art in the most unexpected places!
